>>> ABOUT NCC AT RRCE



NCC of RRCE started in 2021 has been attached to 1 Kar Naval Unit NCC and has total sanctioned strength of 50 cadets which includes 17 girl cadets that were possible only because of then Commanding Officer Cdr. B N Ravi Kiran. All the activities of NCC get started at the beginning of the new academic year in the month of August. Totally 20 parade classes are conducted on Saturdays and general holidays for the enrolled cadets (not disturbing the academics of the students). During the parade time, various activities like drills, weapon training, and theory classes on naval subjects were conducted for the students. Foot Drill, Arms Drills, Weapon Training, Leadership, Civil Defense, First Aid, Hygiene and Sanitation, National Integration, Support to Civil Authority, Social Service, Adventure Activities, Self-Defense, Ecology and Nature Awareness., etc. are taught to the cadets. Cadets also excel in the activities conducted in camps like Republic Day Camp (RDC), Independence Day Camp (IDC), Ek Bharath Shresta Bharath (EBSB), Combined Annual Training Camp, (CATC), Basic and Advanced Leadership Camp, the most awaited trekking expeditions, Nau Sainik Camp, etc. by showing a tremendous level of endurance and grit. Communication, Navigation, Seamanship, Boat work, Anti-Submarine Warfare, Seaward Defense, Damage Control, Ship Safety, Firefighting, Ship and Boat Modeling. So that the cadets get benefits from NCC. Every Year 'B' and 'C' certificate exams are conducted for 2nd and 3rd years cadets. These certificate exams are add on to their resume and benefit the cadets when they are willing to join defense services or any other govt. or private services, leadership quality, team building, high motivation, dedication and physically fit cadets make their way into the new world.









NCC DETAILS >>>

The National Cadet Corps is the Indian military cadet corps with its head Quarters at New Delhi. It is open to school and college students on voluntary basis. The National Cadet Corps in India are a voluntary organization which recruits cadets from high schools, colleges, and Universities all over India. The Cadets are given basic military training in small arms and parades. The officers and cadets have no liability for active military service once they complete their course but are given preference over normal candidates during selections based on the achievements in the corps

MOTTO OF NCC >>>

The need for having motto for the Corps was discussed in the 11th Central Advisory Committee (CAC) meeting held on 11 Aug 1978. The mottos suggested were "Duty and Discipline"; "Duty, Unity and Discipline"; "Duty and Unity"; "Unity and Discipline". The final decision for selection of "Unity and Discipline" as motto for the NCC was taken in the 12th CAC meeting held on 12 Oct 1980.

AIMS OF NCC >>>



NCC FLAG >>>





The NCC flag for various units of the NCC was first introduced in 1951. The flag was of same pattern, colour and size as was used by various regiments of the Army. The only difference was that it had the NCC badge and unit designation placed in the centre. Later on it was felt that the flag should be in keeping with the inter-service character of the Corps. In 1954 the existing tricolour flag was introduced. The three colours in the flag depict the three services of the Corps, red for the Army, deep blue for the Navy and light blue for the Air Force. The letters NCC and the NCC crest in gold in the middle of the flag encircled by a wreath of lotus, give the flag a colourful look and a distinct identity.






